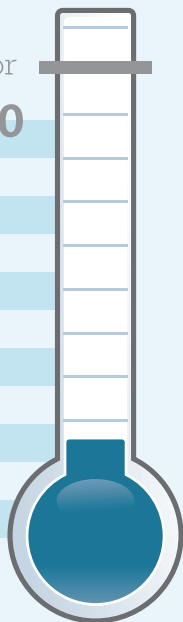

Windham Hospital Foundation sets goal of \$500,000 for FY 2012

The Board of Trustees of the Windham Hospital Foundation has set a goal for its fundraising activities at \$500,000 for the 2012 fiscal year. Projects to be funded include: state-of-the-art EKG transmission capability for our paramedic program to reduce times to cardiac catheterization for heart attack patients, a new cardiac stress system that will assist in the coordination of care with Hartford HealthCare while providing stress testing locally, and portable sleep medicine equipment allowing patients to be tested in the comfort of their own home. These are just some of the advancements that will be possible through generous support from our community.

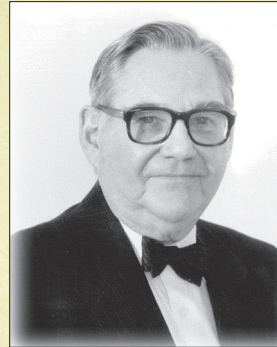

Surgical/Wound Clinic Opens

Thanks to the generosity of our donors this year, Windham Hospital created a Surgical/Wound Clinic in the Hatch Wing. Over 800 patients were seen in the clinic from November 1, 2010 through September 30, 2011 by our surgical team of Drs. Kloss, Kolodziejczak, Ridyard and Siracusa. Comprehensive surgical evaluations, surgical interventions, outpatient post-op care, biopsies, and evaluation and treatment of all types of wounds are handled in our new Clinic.

Since many of our patients have limited or no insurance coverage, without this new Surgical/Wound Clinic, people would have to travel out of our community to be seen by a participating provider or to receive appropriate wound care. Thank you for helping us to improve access to quality services right here in our community.
